Parent Helpers

After half term we would like to invite in any parents who would like to help in the classroom. This could be listening to readers, playing number, word or sound games or cutting/sticking resources for the class. If you are not DBS cleared with us, then please contact the school office who will be able to provide you with the relevant application information.

We would like all volunteers to attend a short volunteers meeting (enquire at the office for times) and then liaise with your class teacher to arrange suitable times for coming in.

Woodland Explorers in Reception

The woodland at Holmesdale School is part of our educational environment and we utilise this area, based upon the Forest School philosophy. Forest School is a holistic approach to learning which fosters the children's natural sense of enquiry as they explore in the outdoor environment. Although we are not a designated 'Forest School', we can teach the children some basic skills and knowledge they will need to promote their learning in all areas of the curriculum.

The skills and knowledge the children will gain are:

- The woodland rules of how to keep themselves and others safe during their outdoor experience.
- To dress independently and appropriately for different weather conditions.
- To develop their listening and attention skills through collaborative games and activities.
- To use tools and equipment appropriately and safely.
- To negotiate with their peers by listening to each other's ideas and working cooperatively together.
- To develop their own ideas and creativity using natural resources.
- To have the confidence and perseverance to learn through trial and error without a sense of failure.
- To develop independence and a sense of self-esteem in what they can do.
- To make choices while developing the skills and learning that have been demonstrated to them.
- To respect the woodland and come to understand how they can play a role in preservation and maintenance of their school woodland and the wider environment.

All Reception children will have the opportunity to go to the woodland, usually for an hour once a fortnight. We will provide waterproof trousers but would ask you to provide **named Wellington boots in a bag and a suitable warm, waterproof coat on their scheduled day.** Named hats and gloves will be needed in cold weather. Children can get muddy and a little wet as we do go out in the rain and during the winter.

We plan to start our 'Woodland Explorers' sessions next week:

Wednesday 11th 2023 October for Rabbits

Thursday 19th October for Ducks and Foxes

Thank you for your support in providing your child with the appropriate clothing and footwear on the relevant day.

Autumn

As we are observing the changes of a new season, please support your child by looking for signs of autumn and by collecting and sending into school any conkers, interesting leaves, acorns etc. (Please do not bring in any nuts as we have children in who are severely allergic to these.) We invite children to bring in any autumnal stories or non-fiction books that they may have at home to share with their peers.

Reading Books

Your child will be bringing home their first reading book on Thursday 12th October. These books

are wordless books. Wordless books are designed to develop your child's vocabulary, storytelling skills and develop the idea that, in many books, the pictures and story are connected.
