### Reading

Your child is on their journey to becoming a skilled reader. Each week children either have an opportunity to read individually to an adult or to take part in a Little Wandle group reading session, where they practise reading a book that is matched to their phonetic level of development. We ask that you support them by listening to them read their book at home and writing a short comment in their reading diary. Teachers value your thoughts and comments as they add to our overall assessment. Children also need the opportunity to re-read books to develop their confidence and fluency. We realise that some parents may feel time pressured or that children may feel tired so books can be read over a couple of days- "little and often."

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for sharing other books with your child. Sharing books makes a big difference to your child's education.

#### Did you know?

Reading a book and chatting about it has a positive impact on your child's ability to:

- understand words and sentences
- use a wide range of vocabulary
- develop listening comprehension skills

Reading books your child has chosen to read for pleasure is one of the best things you can do to help them succeed at school. A love of reading is the biggest indicator of future academic success!
