## Eco Activities at Holmesdale

To raise our children's awareness of the environment and empower them to think about how they can make positive changes, we are introducing some new green initiatives:

#### Eco-Hero Certificate – design competition

We are aware that many children are interested in doing their bit to help the environment outside school, whether it is visiting a library, donating old toys to a charity or doing litter picking in their neighbourhood and we would like to celebrate their efforts by creating a special Eco-Hero Certificate they will receive in school.

## **NOTICES FOR RECEPTION PARENTS**

#### Woodland Explorers in Reception

#### **Reception Nativity**

We are delighted that Reception children will be taking part in a Nativity performance on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> December and Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December. This year's performance will take place in our school hall and children will tell the story of the Nativity primarily through song.

Your child is invited to choose to dress up as any character from the Christmas story or wear festive attire. Please send in your child's choice of costume (in a clearly labelled bag) by **Monday 27**<sup>th</sup> **November 2023.** 

For your convenience, please find a list of The Nativity characters and suggested costumes below. Feel free to adapt the suggestions as necessary. We do not expect you to buy outfits and are very happy with homemade ones.

#### Your child can choose to dress up as one of the following:

- **Angel:** White ankle-length, long-sleeved dress with silver or gold tinsel (you can decide where to attach this), small wings and a silver or gold halo.
- **Innkeeper**: Dressing gown with plain, dark-coloured trousers and a tea towel with something to keep it on their head e.g. tie, rope or elasticated hairband.
- Star: T-shirt with leggings. (You could cut out star shapes and stick onto your t-shirt)
- King: Crown, cloak or cape, with similar coloured trousers and T-shirt.
- **Shepherd**: Dressing gown with plain, trousers and a tea towel with something to keep it on their head, e.g. tie, rope or elasticated hairband. Your child could bring in a crook or a cuddly lamb. Please do not send in a precious toy as it could go astray.
- **Mary**: Blue, ankle-length, long-sleeved dress with a matching piece of cloth for their head and a tie, rope or elasticated hairband, to hold it on.
- **Joseph**: Dressing gown with plain, dark-coloured trousers with a tea towel and something to keep it on their head e.g. tie, rope or elasticated hairband.
- Festive attire: Christmas jumper/festive party clothes.

Please let your class teacher know if you are unable to source or provide a costume for your child.

#### **Talking Point**

We recognise the importance of parent and child conversation and the part it plays in developing a child's vocabulary, speaking and listening skills. Please look out for the **'Talking Point'** in the learning letter. Each week we will add a question which you can pose to your child to begin a
