R&Be Active - February Half Term Holiday Activities – from R & B Borough Council

NOTICES FOR RECEPTION PARENTS

Maths Games

On Monday 22nd January games will be sent home on a fortnightly rota between the four classes. These games provide an enjoyable way of consolidating your child's learning whilst encouraging turn taking and fair play.

We have two sets of games to share between the 3 classes. This will give your child the opportunity to borrow games during a 2-week period approximately every 4 weeks. Children in **Foxes** and Ducks **will choose a game on Monday 22nd January** and may change their games on any day up to Wednesday 1st **February** (all to be returned on **Thursday 2nd February**). Games for Rabbits will be available between Monday 5th February and Wednesday 21st February (all returned on Thursday 22nd February).

When it is your child's turn for the games, they will be given a game on the Monday. You may keep the game for as long as you like (within the 2-week period) or swap it for another. Should you wish to swap the game, a box will be outside the classroom at drop off. Please return the game, cross off the game number next to your child's name on the class list and then enter the new game number that you have chosen to borrow.

Each game is packaged in a plastic folder and comes complete with the necessary playing pieces. We have explained to the children that these games must be treated carefully. However, accidents can happen. If any game gets damaged or lost, please send in £5 so that we can replace it.

If you mislay a playing piece, please try to replace it with a substitute from home. If this is not possible, send a note in with your child to let us know which piece is missing so that we can replace it before it goes home with another child. Likewise, please let us know if a game does come home with a playing piece missing.

Games can be made more or less challenging by adapting the playing rules, for example combining totals from 2 dice instead of one, doubling numbers etc.

We hope you will enjoy playing the games together at home.

Maize Starch, Rice Flour, Sourdough 13% (Rice Flour, Water), Water, Potato Starch, Thickener: Hydroxypropyl Methyl Cellulose (E-464), Rice Starch, Maize Flour, Glucose Syrup, Yeast, Dextrose, Extra Virgin Olive Oil 1,6%, Sunflower Oil, Vegetable Fibre (Psyllium), lodised Salt (Salt, Potassium Iodide), Ethyl Alcohol, **Soya** Protein, Raising Agents: Glucono-Delta-Lacton (E-575), Sodium Bicarbonate [E-500(i)], Acids: Tartaric Acid (E-334), Citric Acid (E-330)
