Dear Families



We had an assembly where some of the teachers acted out the story of *The Gruffalo*










We dressed up as our favourite book characters.



We finished off our space topic by trying some space fruit. We used words like crunchy, dry and sweet to describe it.










We have really enjoyed learning some traditional tales. We have been building houses for the three pigs and sharing the porridge for the three little bears.

We learnt a lot about Amelia Earhart and had to recreate her movements in an aeroplane. It was very exciting.

















Each challenge can be completed at home, at the park and with friends and family. Have fun and enjoy.










Pick a card from underneath the egg, then perform the activity for one minute. How could you challenge yourself? Could you beat your time / score?
