Education of this nature is continually given to children, and often to whole school during assemblies, class time and PSHE lessons. • Lottie will be introduced to the school slowly and always with his owner. All staff will be introduced to the dog and the expectations (dos and don'ts) of having a dog in school. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lottie's owner will ensure his claws are well maintained and of appropriate length. 	Dog hair causing allergies in adults or pupils	Pupils/staff	Parents have been asked to inform the school of any known allergies prior to introduction of Lottie to school. A list of any children who should not interact with the dog will be kept on the school records. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will have the opportunity to interact with the dog in a controlled environment and those with allergies will be able to opt out of interaction. • Children will be taught to wash their hands after active participation with the dog. Staff can choose not to interact with Lottie if they are aware of an allergy.	M	Y	Letter sent to parents

Pupils or staff getting germs from the dog	Pupils/staff	In the unlikely event Lottie should urinate or defecate in the school building or grounds: Lottie's owner or a member of staff will clear this up immediately and dispose of it in a safe manner, if required the area will then be disinfected with an appropriate disinfectant. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All immunisations are kept up to date in accordance with European Pet Passport scheme. • Flea and tick treatment is carried out at monthly intervals. • Worming treatment is carried out in line with European Vet guidelines at 3 monthly intervals.
