We went for a woodland walk. played games and finally sat down to eat our delicious picnic - what a lovely way to start our year together!














We have enjoyed the story 'Knuffle Bunny' and used socks to create our own bunnies!



We had a selection of adjectives and we had to find items linked to that word. Do you think we found any beautiful, bright green or crinkled objects?


