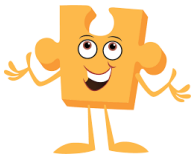


Year 1

This week we are learning:	
English 	To use the suffix “-ed” to form past tense verbs. To use time conjunctions.
Phonics 	We will be reviewing these new sounds: /ai/ eigh, aigh ey, ea /n/ kn gn /m/ mb /ear/ ere eer We will be reviewing these new tricky words: Busy Beautiful Pretty Hour
Handwriting 	To begin to form a diagonal join from letters to ascenders correctly.
Maths 	To understand and compare units of time and choose the best one to measure how long activities take. I can read and tell the time to the hour using an analogue clock.
Reading 	To read for pleasure.
Science 	To recognise that new plants come from seeds and bulbs. To recognise that observations do not always match predictions.
PSHE 	To identify the parts of the body that make boys different to girls and use the correct names for these: penis, testicles, vulva, anus. To respect my body and understand which parts are private. To learn more about sun safety.

Music 	Song of the week: Saint-Saëns: Elephant from The Carnival of the Animals To listen to and talk about what they like or dislike about the piece of music. To name instruments they can hear or see. To decide if the music is fast or slow. To explain how the music makes them feel. Learn the following songs: - On your Way Home - James and the Giant Peach On Your Way Home ~ James and the Giant Peach: The Musical - Explorer and the Bear - Paddington The Explorer & The Bear - When I Grow Up - Matilda Matilda - When I Grow Up with lyrics
PE 	To use skills individually and in combination to suit the game. To can move to defend the goal. To can describe what they have done or seen others doing.
History 	To learn about the history of Reigate Castle.
Geography 	To plan our route to Reigate Castle Grounds. To walk to Reigate Castle Grounds, spot features along the route and locate them on our maps.
RE 	To think about how everyone can care for the world we all share. To find out about what some people in the past thought about how we should care for our world.
Art 	To listen to and recall information about Claude Monet. To develop colour mixing skills to represent water. To develop skills in cutting, arranging and layering creating a collage.

We have added alien words; these are words that will not make sense but can be decoded and blended. Don't forget to look out for those digraphs and trigraphs.
