





This week we are learning:	
English 	To write a postcard. To write an evaluation.
Phonics 	To review the following sounds: ea as in head ou as in shoulder ow as in snow g as in giant To revise the following tricky words: any, many, again, who, whole, where two, school, call, different, thought, through, friend, work.
Handwriting 	To practise joins learnt so far. To practise keeping writing evenly sized and on the lines.
Maths 	To understand tens and ones. To add ones using number bonds. To find and make number bonds to 20.
Reading 	To read for pleasure. To recommend books to others.
Science 	To investigate which materials are waterproof.
PSHE 	To practise mindful movements learnt during 'Feeling Good' Week.
Music 	To listen to and talk about what they like or dislike about the piece of music. We will be listening to Gertrude 'Ma' Rainey - Runaway Blues. To learn songs and rhymes that Victorian children may have sung and recited.

<p>Art</p> 	<p>To do an observational drawing.</p>
<p>PE</p> 	<p>To perform shapes and hold shapes with control.</p>
<p>History</p> 	<p>To recognise in what ways our lives are different from the lives of people in the past.</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>To give examples of personal information. To understand that we need to tell a trusted adult immediately if we feel worried when accessing the internet.</p>
<p>RE</p> 	<p>To read the story of 'The Good Samaritan' and understand what Christians might learn from stories told by Jesus.</p>
